## ENGINEERING ENGLISH LABORATORY (COMMON TO ALL BRANCHES)

## The following are the **objectives** of the course:

To enable the students to

- learn the speech sound of English
- learn the word stress in English
- learn the rhythm and intonation of English
- improve their articulation skills
- improve their participation skills

## The following are the **outcomes** of the course:

The students will be able to

- produce the sounds of English effectively
- use the word stress appropriately
- apply the rhythm and intonation of English in their communication
- articulate well in their communication
- participate effectively in communication

Note: While teaching the following items, emphasis may be laid on intensive practice in the language lab. Lecturing may be avoided as far as possible.

- 1. **Introduction to English Phonetics**: Organs of Speech: the respiratory, articulatory and phonatory systems
- Sounds of English: Phonemic sounds, Introduction to International Phonetic Alphabet, Classification and description of English phonetic sounds; Minimal pairs; The syllable
- 3. **Word Stress**: Primary stress, Secondary stress, Functional stress, Rules of word stress
- 4. **Aspects of Connected Speech**: Strong forms, Weak forms, Contracted forms, Elision
- 5. **Rhythm and Intonation**: Introduction of rhythm and intonation; Major patterns of intonation in English with their semantic implications; Difficulties of Indians speakers with stress and intonation
- 6. **Use of Dictionary and Thesaurus**: Advantages of using a dictionary and a thesaurus, Effective use of a dictionary and a thesaurus
- 7. **Speaking Activities**: JAM, Picture perception
- 8. Listening Activities: Activities based on listening
- 9. PowerPoint Presentations: General topics
